The 2004-2005 Division II All-Academic Team consists of 108 student-athletes from 24 universities and colleges. Thirty-four members were named to the first team, 35 to the second team and 39 were named as honorable mentions. The University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska at Kearney both placed nine members on the first or second teams. The University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown placed six members and Augustana College and West Liberty State College both placed five members.

Eight student athletes were named to the team for the fourth time. They include Adam Keiswetter, Aaron Dalton and Jared Jorgenson, all from the University of Nebraska at Kearney; Matthew Roncolato and Ryan Ickes, both from the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown; Corey Wellnitz from Northern State University; Luke Main from West Liberty State College and Dustin Tovar from the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Thirteen athletes were named to the team for the third time. They include Jacob Froscheiser, Bryce Abbey and Todd Shank, all from the University of Nebraska at Kearney; Joshua Janson from Minnesota State University-Moorhead; Aaron Graumann from Augustana College; Kristopher Klepacz from the University of Findlay; Mitch Napier from the University of Indianapolis; Mitch Waite from the University of Nebraska at Omaha; Donald Lockett from San Francisco State University; Ryan Mazzocco from the University of Pennsylvania; Dillon Waggoner from Western State College of Colorado; and Mike Engelmann from Minnesota State University-Mankato.

In order for a student-athlete to be nominated for the Division II All-Academic Team, he needed to have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. He must also be in at least his second full year at his school, be a varsity member on his team or a key reserve, demonstrate a degree of skill and have a minimum of two letters of recommendation (academic advisor and coach) submitted on his behalf.

Other winners have been the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Fort Hays State University, Colorado School of Mines, University of Nebraska at Kearney, Minnesota State University-Mankato, Truman State University and West Liberty State College. The team GPA is calculated by averaging the cumulative grade point averages of ten wrestlers from each team of which eight of those wrestlers must have competed in their team's NCAA II National Qualifying tournament.
