The 2005-2006 Division II All-Academic Team consists of 125 student-athletes from 29 universities and colleges. Forty-one members were named to the first team, 36 to the second team and 48 were named as honorable mentions. The University of Nebraska at Omaha placed ten members on the first or second teams. The University of Nebraska at Kearney placed eight members, and the University of Pitt-Johnstown and Augustana College both placed five members. Four student athletes were named to the team for the fourth time. They are Mitch Waite from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Ryon Mazzocco from the University of Pitt-Johnstown, Dillon Waggoner from Western State College of Colorado and Todd Shank from the University of Nebraska at Kearney. Twenty-one athletes were named to the teams for the third time. They include Patrick Allibone, Steve Conlin, Dan Hillario and Nate Oviatt, all from the University of Nebraska at Omaha; Tim Boldt, Ryan King and Cody Henriksen all from Augustana College; Jeff Slyvester and Joshua Tolin both from the University of Nebraska at Kearney; Michael Fowler and Eli Garshick both from University of Pitt-Johnstown; Gregg Nurrenbern from Truman State University; Andrew Uhl from the University of Findlay; Rick Schmoll from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside; Paul Bergman from Mercyhurst College; William Eller from Colorado School of Mines; James Thomas from Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania; Jameson Bolen from West Liberty State College; Justin Cooper from Central Missouri State University; Cody Mumma from Western State College of Colorado; and Heath Soderstrom from Adam State College. One student athlete, Chris Taylor from West Liberty College has a perfect 4.0 G.P.A.

In order for a student-athlete to be nominated for the Division II All-Academic Team, he needed to have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. He must also be in at least his second full year at his school, be a varsity member on his team or a key reserve, demonstrate a degree of skill and have a minimum of two letters of recommendation (academic advisor and coach) submitted on his behalf.

Colorado School of Mines recorded the highest team grade point average (GPA) in the thirteenth annual Division II All-Academic Wrestling Team selection and won the Academic National Championship. Their GPA is the second highest ever recorded. It is second only to the 3.519 that the University of Nebraska at Kearney in 2004. Colorado School of Mines has now won the Academic National Title five times. Previous Championships were won in 1995, 1996, 1998 and 1999. Seven other NCAA II schools have also won the National Championship. They include the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Fort Hays State University, West Liberty State College, Truman State University (twice), Minnesota State University-Mankato, the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

The Team GPA is calculated by averaging the cumulative grade point averages of ten wrestlers from each team of which eight of those wrestlers must have competed in their team's NCAA II National Qualifying tournament.
